Food Resources

Before visiting any of these locations, please call them to ensure there are no changes to their hours of operation. You can also find additional information, such as if they cater to dietary restrictions or other resources they offer beyond food.

Local Food Resources

1. Greater Park Hill Community Food Bank, 2823 Fairfax St., Denver CO 80207. Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 am - 1 pm. Only employees and regularly scheduled volunteers will be permitted to spend time in the office.
2. The St. Vincent De Paul Society Conference distributes food based on calls they receive using their hotline. The hotline is 303-955-2578 anyone is welcome to call for support.
3. Denver Inner City Parish, 1212 Mariposa St., (303) 629-0636. They are operating a drive-up food pickup Wednesday and Saturday mornings starting at 9 am.
4. MetroCaring 1100 E. 18th Ave. Denver, CO 80218, (303) 860-7200. Open daily for appointments only. Call or book online at <https://www.metrocaring.org>.
5. Weinberg Food Pantry, Jewish Family Service, 3201 South Tamarac Drive Denver, CO 80231, (303) 597-5000. Open on Tuesdays Wednesdays, or Fridays, 9:30 am to 1:00 pm, or the second Thursday of each month, 3:45 to 6:00 pm.
6. Praise Center Church, 3105 W Florida Avenue, Denver, CO 80219, (303) 922-1131. The Food Pantry is open on the 4th Saturday of every month 10:30-11:30 am.

Metro Denver Food Resources

1. Westwoods Community Church Food Bank (Joy's Kitchen), 7700 W Woodard Dr, Lakewood, CO 80227, (303) 279-1616. They are open every other Tuesday 11:30 am - 12:45 pm; Thursdays 6:00 pm - 7:45 pm; See calendar on website as dates and times may change.
2. Belmar Baptist Church, 460 S Kipling Street, Lakewood, CO 80226, (303) 986-5500. Their hours are Thursdays 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm (Doors open at 5:30 pm). There are no pre-qualifiers, and all are welcome. Doors open at 5:30 pm, and food is given out between 6:30 pm and 8:30 pm. A photo ID is requested but not required. All services are free.

3. The Action Center, 8745 W. 14th Ave, Lakewood, CO 80215, (720) 215-4850. The food pantry is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday: 9 am - last appt 3 pm; Thursday: 11 am - last appt 4:00pm. By appointment only. Call to make an appointment before showing up. There is a clothing bank and some counseling services. Need proof of Jefferson County residency and ID, or homeless in Jefferson County.
4. Community Table, 8555 W 57th Ave. Arvada CO, 80002, (303) 424-6685. Feeds the hungry in Arvada, and the organization needs help as it gears up to feed those who may need their assistance for the first time because of COVID-19. As of March 16, food distribution is by box only on a drive up/walk up basis. Call for more information.
5. Covenant Cupboard Food Pantry, Presbyterian Church of the Covenant, 5400 South Yosemite St Greenwood Village, CO 80111, (720) 841-5129. Thursdays and Fridays and is designed with social distancing in mind. Call for more information.
6. Meals on Wheels, (303) 294-0111. An individual must be 60 years of age or older and assessed as homebound to receive Meals on Wheels. Other criteria for eligibility apply in specific limited circumstances. Please include your name, address and phone number when contacting us for eligibility. There is no charge for the meals, but individuals who receive Meals on Wheels are asked to contribute what they can afford toward the cost of the meals.
